Then we are off to the Panorama Route in the Mpumalanga province to see the Blyde River Canyon and Bourke's Luck potholes before returning to Johannesburg

#### Kruger National Park

The flagship of South Africa's game reserves and the ultimate destination for the wildlife fanatics. It is a spectacular piece of land stretch over 19000 km2. The park was established in 1898. This area supports 147 mammal species including 13000 elephants, 40 000 buffalo, 2000 lions and more rhinos than in any other protected areas in South Africa.

#### The big five can easily be viewed in one day.

Private inclusive and concession lodges situated inside and around the park are ranked among the most exclusive and prestigious in Africa.

Day	Activities for the day
1	Travel to Kruger Park from the meeting point. Afternoon drive with your tour guide for 3 hours or alternatively book a guided Safari sunset drive at the park.



Day	Activities for the day
2	Safari day in the Kruger National Park KNP. The client has the choice of time spent on drives. Drives start anytime from 6 am to 5:30 pm. With abandon of wildlife, the south of the park is the most populated and has the highest concentration of wildlife in the Kruger. In this area between Lower Sabi and Skukuza are more leopards per square kilometer than anywhere in else in South Africa. Wild dogs and Cheetahs are also indigenous to this area. One of the antelopes that people specifically look out for is Sables. Panic Lake is a must see as you are sitting in a hide right on top of the lake, an absolute bird lover's paradise. We will stop at Transport Dam where the famous YouTube Video "Battle of the Kruger took Place." At Sunset dam is always a heap of activities with all the crocodiles, hippos and antelopes coming to drink water. At Lower Sabi Restaurant the deck gives you a view over the river with plenty of wildlife around. Elephant, hippos, crocodiles, and leopard across the river. At Stephenson heads there is a chance of seeing some more leopards or the pride of lions hanging around the area. Bird Lovers can be on the lookout for all the different Bird of Prey for e.g., Bateleurs, Martial eagles, owls, fish eagles and much more.
3	Safari in Kruger, continue to the more central part of Satara (6-7 hours' drive to Orpen gate). Satara is known for one of the biggest pride of lions in the Kruger. The Kruger is a spectacular piece of land stretching over 19000 km2 . The park support 147 mammal species include 13000 Elephants, 40 000 Buffalo, 2000 Lions and more Rhinos than in other protected area in South Africa.
4	Safari in Kruger, explore the Satara area. Be on the lookout for Casper, Footloose and Mfowethu, the three white lion brothers controlling the Satara and Nsemani Lion Prides. Cheetah and wild dogs also roam this area.

<b>Day</b>	Activities for the day   We start our day in the Limpopo province and then continue into the beautiful province of Mpumalanga, meaning the place where the sun rises.   Mohololoholo Wildlife Rehabilitation Centre (2hour stop)   Mohololoholo Centre is a facility who offer a unique experience for all nature lovers.   Their service focuses on rehabilitation and rescue of animals from the surrounding areas. Wild dags and vultures are just some of the animals brought to the Centre, Research form part of the Centre.   Relocations of animals is also one of the Panorama route. The tranquilizing beauty of nature provides you with spectacular views of the third largest Canyon in the world and the largest green canyon. At 1,219 m, the Blyderivierspoort Nature Reserve near Graskop is characterized by striking rock formations and a rich diversity of plants. The famous Three Rondawels and more than one thousand flora species can be seen like nowhere else in the world.   • Bourke's luck Potholes (Entrance Fees Included ± 1 Hour)   Over millennia, swirling whirlpools between the confluence of the Treur (meaning sad) and Blyde (meaning happy) river. You can explore the area on foot or via sturdy overhead bridges overlooking the potholes below. The Bourke's Luck potholes formed by river erosion and the eactorn of floadwater. The Blyde River Canyon is a 20km long gorge carved out of the face of the eacarpment and is one of the natural wonders of Africa. You have the feeling of walking on the moon.   Lunch is at the restaurant on site (not included). • Gods Window (Entrance Fees Included ± 30 Min Stop)   The most well-known of the viewpoints in the area, God's Window is perched on the edge of the escarpm

Day	Activities for the day
6	You have the choice of doing ONE of the following activities before we head back to Johannesburg. Graskop Gorge (excluded) The Graskop Gorge Lift is the first of its kind in the Southern Hemisphere. It takes you 50 m down a sheer cliff face to the valley floor in the forest below. You can explore further via a network of suspension bridges and walkways along forest trails and across mountain streams. You can also take a swing through the Gorge or Zipline over it. Entrance fee: 13 USD pp Swing: 35 USD pp Zipline: 13 USD pp OR Pilgrimsrest See where the Mpumalanga gold rush started, still in its original. Declared as National Monument in 1986. See yourself sitting in the Hotel and imaging yourself its back in the day their everybody looking for gold prospecting. They say the ground still holds gold up today, Experience the different stores from the post. OR Sabi Waterfalls (Fees can be include in the final packages) Do waterfall hoping with breath-taking views. Include on this package are: Lone creek, Briddi veil, Horseshoe, and Sabie Falls Stop for Lunch (own Account) OR Sudwala Caves (Fees will be include in the final packages) This is one of the oldest caves in the world resting inside the pre-cambrian dolomite. The cave system is over 300km in length which is accessible for 600m. There is a display of an incredible array of mighty chambers studded with giant stalactites, stalagmites, and flowstone formations.

#### Sudwala Crystal Cave tour

Spend a half day for 40 USD pp Climbing deep into the cave system with a guide and explore the earth from inside. This is not for the faint hearted and claustrophobic person. This tour will take you 4 hours. Bookings need to be made 14 days in advance. Deposit is not refundable.

This tour starts at 10h00 in the morning and only five people are allowed. Wear comfortable clothes and sneakers as there is a lot of climbing happening in slippery areas. You need to provide your own headlight. No jewelry, food or drinks allowed during the cave tour.

#### **Pilgrim rest**

Travel back through time in Pilgrims Rest, a restored gold mining village dating back to the 1900 century. This is where the Mpumalanga gold rush started, still in its original form. It was declared as a national monument in 1986. Sitting in the Hotel imagining yourself the buss back in the days. There is still gold in the ground today.
