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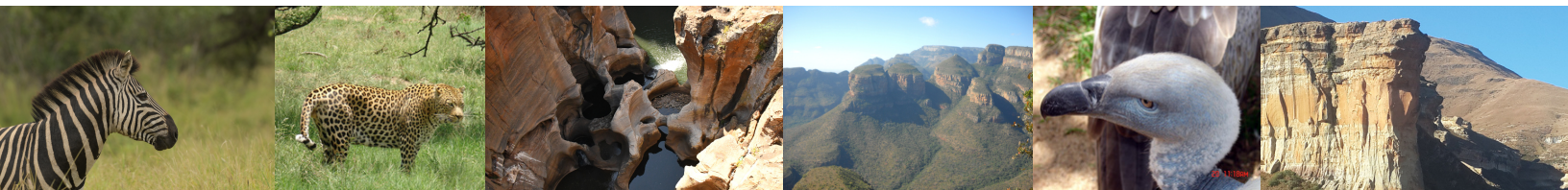

This area supports 147 Mammal species including 13000 Elephants, 40 000 Buffalo, 2000 Lions and more Rhinos than in other protected areas. The most inclusive private and concession lodges are in and near the Kruger, and ranked among the most exclusive and prestigious in Africa.

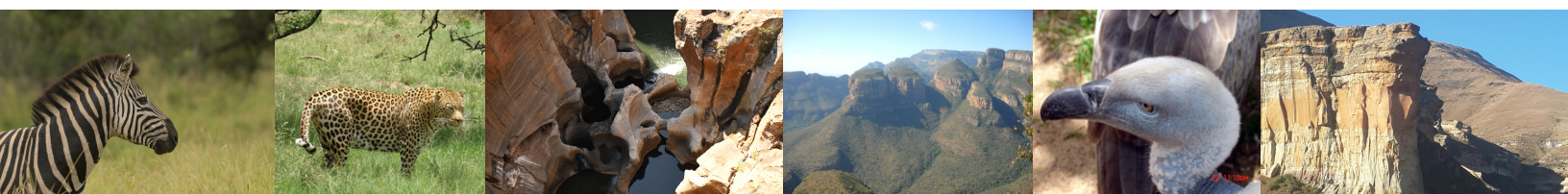
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Important Information for Visitors to Kruger Park

Here are some key points to keep in mind when planning your visit to Kruger Park:

- Ablution blocks, picnic spots, and restaurants are situated within the camp in designated areas.
- Kruger Park changes its pricing in May each year.
- Prices are subject to the exchange rate of the South African Rand.
- Terms and conditions are available upon booking.
- The ideal time to visit Kruger Park is between May and October during the dry winter season.
- November to December is the period when newborns arrive.
- During school holidays, day visitors may face restrictions due to high demand. Online bookings, at an additional cost, are available to secure entry into the park.
- Special rates are available for SACPT clients.
- Once your booking is confirmed, a detailed itinerary and final quotation will be provided.
- Please note that Kruger Park is in a malaria area and you should take prophylaxis as prescribed by your medical practitioner.
- Please do not share the location of any rhinos on social media platforms.
- Do not hang out of vehicle windows or sunroofs.
- You are only allowed to leave the vehicle in specific designated areas.
- Feeding the animals is strictly prohibited.

Day	Activities for the day
1 & 2	<p>We will depart from our location to Magoebaskloof to visit the spectacular cycad forest and where Modjadji the rain queen ruled. Modjadji Rain Queen – a revered local monarch whose matrilineal line dates to the 16th century but ended in 2005 with the death of Makobo Constance Modjadji VI. The cycad is one of two extant populations of the eponymous cycad, a peculiar prehistoric palm-like tree that grows up to 12 m (39 ft) tall, and was protected for generations by the Modjadji Rain Queen. The Giant Baobab tree is a must see. It is the world's biggest specimen of this magnificent species, with a circumference of 47 m (155 ft) and a bar set within its central cavity. The tree is around six thousand years old. We will stop at the Debengeni Waterfall. This waterfall is an idyllic example of the untouched, untainted appeal of Limpopo Province. The Ramadipha River tumbles eighty meters into the massive bowl of water at its base, demonstrating the unharnessed power of nature. These are two relaxed days before the long drive through the Kruger Park starts.</p>



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3, 4 & 5	We will start our drive to Punda Maria and spend the next 2,5 days exploring the northern part of Kruger Park. We will enter the Park at the Punda Maria Gate. We will drive through the beautiful fever tree forest, which is the largest in the world. The majestic Boabab trees are also in this area. You will see sandveld nature between Punda Maria and Paffuri. This area has plenty birds, and the area is part of the Afro-tropical zone with many raptors e.g., the Dickenson raptor. When you look closely you will see the Verreaux Eagle nest in the Sandstone cliffs. We will Visit Crookes corner, here the Luvuvhu and Limpopo rivers come together where South Africa, Mozambique and Zimbabwe meet. The name comes from 'people who had no great wish to look into the eyes of the law' and might at any moment need to escape across an international border. Elephant, lions, and buffalo (biggest herd) are in this area. Some of the biggest elephant tuskers can be seen in the northern part of the Kruger. Antelope roaming this area are eland (if we are lucky), bush buck and nyala. Also be on the lookout for the Lichtenstein hartebeest, the rarest antelope in Kruger Park.
6 & 7	Today we will move from the northern part to the central part of the park crossing the Capricorn timeline. This will move through the famous Mopane area, and we will start seeing rhino, elephants, and lions. We will visit the Elephant Museum at Letaba. Here you will see the memories of all the Kruger Giants. Look out for the ground hornbill and the yellow billed oxpecker, one of the rarest birds in the park. You will see them on the back of buffalo and rhinos.
8 & 9	We are moving down to Satara that is known as lion country. Look out for Casper, Footloose and Mfowethu the three white Lion brothers controlling Satara and Nsemani Lion Prides. Also spotted in this area are cheetah, spotted hyena and wild dogs.
10, 11, 12 & 13	With abundance of wildlife, the south of the park is the most populated and has the highest concentration of wildlife in the Kruger. In this area between Lower Sabi and Skukuza are more leopards per square kilometer than anywhere in else in South Africa. Wild dogs and cheetahs are also indigenous to this area. One of the antelopes that people specifically look out for is Sables. Panic Lake is a must see as you are sitting in a hide right on top of the lake, an absolute bird lover's paradise. We will stop at Transport Dam where the famous YouTube Video "Battle of the Kruger took Place." At Sunset dam is always a heap of activities with all the crocodiles, hippos and antelopes coming to drink water. At Lower Sabi Restaurant the deck gives you a view over the river with lots of wildlife around. Elephant, hippos, crocodiles, and leopard across the river. At Stephenson Koppe there is a chance of seeing some more leopards or the pride of lions hanging around the area. Bird Lovers can be on the lookout for all the different Bird of Prey for e.g., Bateleurs, Martial eagles, owls, fish eagles and much more.
14	On our last day we drive to Crocodile bridge gate to exit the park on our way to Johannesburg. This will complete a once in a lifetime tour to travel through the length of Kruger Park and a dream for many.
